Turn your passion into action!

Success requires a combination of hard work and perseverance.

When Elliot was just 10 years old, he met a leopard in Botswana.

It was a close call, and an experience that he will never forget. However, the encounter only intensified his passion for animals, and when he was 16 years old, he started the charity Human Nature Projects. It connects more than 1,400 volunteers in more than 100 countries around the world, all of them working on conservation issues. Elliot is aiming large: with his organization, he wants to get people to reevaluate their relationship with nature--to rethink what it means for us as humans, to share our planet with other species.



Choose an animal species that is endangered in your area.

Create a 5-7 minute video about this species; about why it is endangered, and what can be done to protect it. Finish your video with a Call to Action, to get your peers involved.

Working in groups of 3-5 people, create the content for a website for a fictional conservation project. Your website must be targeted to attract young volunteers. The website must include an About Us section; a section with information about one of the species you want to protect; a FAQs page; a Call to Action page; and two blog posts. Afterwards, create a presentation using the content from your website, and present it to your class.

After watching everyone's presentations, write an essay in which you discuss which presentations were most effective and why. Which of these fictional websites do you think best accomplishes its goal of educating people and getting them engaged in a conservation project? Which websites were more effective, and why?

*** STEM Activities**

The <u>WWF Australia</u>¹ report suggests that as many as 3 billion individual mammals, birds, reptiles, and frogs died or were displaced during the bushfire crisis. Calculate the loss of plant and animal species from the fire. What percentage of Australian species are threatened with extinction as a result of this crisis? How many of those species are unique to Australia? Select one of them and explore what the effect would be if this species were to become extinct.

This <u>lesson plan from the California Academy of Sciences</u>² uses the imaginary location of "Conservation Island" to teach students about some of the real-world issues involved in making plans to save endangered species. Students will learn the concepts behind identifying endangered and extinct animals, and develop their own conservation plans for saving three endangered species on the fictional island.

The conservation charity World Wildlife Fund (WWF)³ has warned that climate change is threatening the existence of the snow leopard in the Himalayas. Research the impacts of climate change on snow leopards and chart their future population trajectory. What human activities are having a significant impact on the sustainability of this species?

Research endangered species that can be found in your community or country, and learn how human activities are contributing to their decreasing population. Then create a website, app, or infographic to raise awareness in your community, by providing information about organizations that are helping to save these species, and how people from the community can support the cause.

Sustainability Innovations
